In the matter of the annual report, Fair Boards Lawrence Greiner, pres. Fair Board explained rating - gate receipts up - more people attending higher rating. discusses membership on Board. Les Smith's term expires Dec 31, 1973. Court approved appointment of Dan Turley to fill vacancy.

In the matter of the jail and courthouse building and remodeling. Mr. Jack Annand presented a space analysis of the St. Joseph Hospital for a Courthouse. this was a continuation of meeting held Oct 25, 1973 Mr. Duane Gilmore requested and was granted 2 weeks to further study and propose the use of the hospital to meet the needs of County Government. Mr. Annand presented a proposal that housed all of county government except emergency operations space with some 2124 sq ft of unused space for future expansion. No decision as this meeting was to gather more information and ideas on possible means of constructing a jail and providing for the needs of the county now and in the future. It was agreed that cost figures are needed-- Public meetings need to be held--

In the matter of the building inspector - re ; emplementation of SB 73- COUNTY COURT feels they cannot provide a Building Inspector.

In the matter of the Hearing 3:00 pm - Planning Commission recommends addition to 40 acre commercial agriculture zone. No one appeared in opposition. Com. Schwebke made motion to accept planning commission recommendation. Judge Misener 2nd, Carried. Court Order to be drawn with map of area.

Planning Commission recommends four basic changes in zoning Ordinance. Com. Schwebke made motion to accept recommended changes in zoning ordinance. Judge Misener 2nd., carried. Court Order to be drawn.
