## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

At the position described above, I set a  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" iron pipe, 28" in the ground with a Brass Cap, marked as shown, from which I scribed BT's:

Fir 8" S 88°54' E, 43.20 ft., Scribed W  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 4 BT.

Fir 9" N  $24^{0}54!$  E, 43.00 ft., Scribed W  $\frac{1}{4}$  s 4 BT.


I nailed a brass washer marked OPLS 1097 to BT blazers.

I set a steel fence post 3 ft. North with signs 54-4.

I painted a red band around BT's and face of scribe.

I used a steel tape and WILD T16 and measured a horizontal distance to the center of the BT's.
