

Corner set from survey by single proportionate measurement

At the corner point, we set a 2"x30" Galvanized Iron Pipe 25" in the ground, with brass cap attached, marked:

From which we mark the following BT's:

A 10" White Fir, scribed "S 1/16 S7 BT on a double blaze bears N45 1/2°W 26.7 ft., and a 12" Larch, scribed S 1/16 S8 BT" on a double blaze bears N71°E 53.0 ft.

Attached brass washer, marked "LS 1099" to lower blaze of each BT.

Placed steel fenceposts 5 ft. S and W of monument with signs 54-2 and 54-9 attached to southerly post and 54-2 to westerly post.

Attached signs and painted BT's per <u>Standard Specifications for Cadastral Survey</u>, U.S.F.S. Region 6, Oct. 1979.
