## History of original corner establishment:

Jacob C. Cooper, 1881, Contract 397

Set: post 4½ feet long 4 ins. square 2 feet in the ground on N side of ridge 150 feet below the summit 250 feet above the bottom of ravine, from which

A fir 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam. bears N 18° E 20 lks. (13.2 ft.) dist. marked T1N R38E S7 BT

A fir 6 ins. diam. bears S 70° E 18 lks. (11.9 ft,) dist. marked T1 N R38E S18 BT

A fir 7 ins. diam. bears S 53° W 9 lks. (5.9 ft.) dist. marked T1N R37 E S13 BT

A fir 7 ins. diam. bears N 69° W 27 lks. (17.8 ft.) dist. marked T1N R37E S12 BT

### Herman A. Gardon, 1882, Contract 452

Found: post 4 ins. square, from which

A fir 2 ½ ins. diam. bears N 18° E 20 lks. (13.2 ft.) dist. marked T1N R38E S7 BT

A fir 6 ins. diam. bears S 70° E 18 lks. (11.9 ft,) dist. marked T1 N R38E S18 BT

A fir 7 ins. diam. bears S 53° W 9 lks. (5.9 ft.) dist. marked T1N R37 E S13 BT

A fir 7 ins. diam. bears N 69° W 27 lks. (17.8 ft.) dist. marked T1N R37E S12 BT John W. Kimbrell, 1891, Contract 579

Found: post 4 ins. square, 4 ½ ft. long, 24 ins. in to ground, from which:

A fir 6 ins. diam. bears S 70° E 18 lks. (13.2 ft.) dist. marked T1 N R38E S18 BT

A fir 7 ins. diam. bears S 53° W 9 lks. (5.9 ft.) dist. marked T1N R38 E S13 BT (error in notes)

A fir 7 ins. diam. bears N 69° W 27 lks. (17.8 ft.) dist. marked T1N R38E S12 BT (error in notes)

The bearing tree in S7 has fallen down and is decaying. I mark a fir 5 ins. dia. bears N 47 E 18 lks (11.9 ft.) dist. marked T1N R38E S7 BT

### Gary Langlitz, PLS 1099, 1980, CS 97-80

Found: No trace of the original corner post, but found the following original bearing trees: A 2 ½" fir, now a 6" dead windfall Douglas Fir, with scribing "38E S7 B" visible on a

partially healed single blaze bears N 73° E 13.2 feet
A 6" fir, now a 10" white fir, alive and in fair condition, with scribing "138S" visible on a partially-healed upper blaze, lower blaze well-healed, bears S 80° E 11.9 feet

A 7" fir, now a 16" white fir, alive with well-healed double blaze bears S 68° W 5.9 feet. A 7" fir, now an 18" grand fir, alive with well-healed double blaze, bears N 50° W 17.8

feet.


Set: a 2" x 30" galvanized iron pipe, 28" in the ground on a steep NW slope, with brass cap, from which:

A 6" white fir, scribed "T1N R38E S7 BT" on a double blaze bears N 49 ½° E 53.1 feet

A 6" spruce, scribed "T1N R38E S18 BT" on a double blaze bears S 19° E 25.7 feet Attached brass washer, marked "LS 1099" to lower blaze of new BTs

Note: While it appears that Langlits use Kimbrell's northeast BT rather than the original Cooper BT, the original bearings have enough error in them that I feel Langlitz's placement of the monument is as good as any other solution that I or another surveyor could find.



## Description of corner evidence found:

Monument Found:

A 2 1/2" brasscap, marked as shown, on a 2 1/2" galvanized iron pipe (not 2" as in record), 5" showing above the ground.

Accessories Found:

No trace of original Cooper NE BT.

A fir, 11 ins. in diam., bears S 81 1/2° E 11.9 ft. (record S 70° E & S 80° E), 6 ft. high stump with scribing 38ES visible on a double blaze. (Orig. BT)

A white fir, 20 ins. in diam., bears S 70 3/4° W 5.9 ft. (record S 53° W & S 68° W), alive & healthy, with healed double blaze. (Orig. BT)

A white fir, 23 ins. in diam., bears N 67 1/4° W 17.8 ft. (record N 69° W & N 50° W) with healed blaze. (Orig. BT)

A fir, 7 ins. in diam., bears N 70° E 13.7 ft. (record N 47° E 11.9 ft. & N 73° E 13.2 ft.), scribing visible. (Kimbrell BT)

A white fir, 11 ins. in diam., bears N 49 1/2° E 53.1 ft., dead & standing. (Langlitz BT) A spruce, 6 ins. in diam. bears S 19° E 25.7 ft., down with full scribing visible on a double blaze. (Langlitz BT)

# Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Accessories Set:

A white fir, 23 ins. in diam., bears N 48 1/4° E 71.3 ft., marked T1NR38ES7 BT on a double blaze with a brass washer marked PLS 2456.

A white fir, 29 ins. in diam., bears S 64 1/2° E 37.9 ft., marked T1N R38ES18 BT on a double blaze, with a brass washer marked PLS 2456.

Red paint, posts and signs added as needed.

#### CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment: Record of the original survey by J. Cooper, 1881, states: Set post 4½ ft. long, 4 ins. square, 2 ft. in the ground, on N side of ridge 150 ft. below the summit, 250 ft. above the bottom of ravine, for cor. to Secs. 7, 12, 13, 18, marked:

TIN S7 on NE

R38E S18 on SE

R37E S13 on SW

S12 on NW faces with 4 notches on the S and 2 notches

on the N edges, from which:

A Fir,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam. bears N18°E 20 lks. dist., marked T1N R38E S7 BT. A Fir, 6 ins. diam. bears S70°E 18 lks. dist., marked T1N R38E S18 BT. A Fir, 7 ins. diam. bears S53°W 9 lks. dist., marked T1N R37E S13 BT. A Fir, 7 ins. diam. bears N69°W 27 lks. dist. marked T1N R37E S12 BT.

Description of corner evidence found:

No trace of the original corner post could be found. We establish the True Corner Point in the following relationship to the original bearing trees as follows:

An orig.  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fir, now a 6" dead windfall Douglas Fir, with scribing "38E S7 B" visible on a partially healed single blaze bears N73 E 13.2 ft.

An orig. 6" Fir, now a 10" White Fir, alive and in fair condition, with scribing "138S" visible on a partially-healed upper blaze, lower blaze well-healed, bears S80°E 11.9 ft.

An orig. 7" Fir, now a 16" White Fir, alive with well-healed double blaze bears S68<sup>0</sup>W 5.9 ft.

And an orig. 7" Fir, now an 18" Grand Fir, alive with well-healed double blaze, bears N50°W 17.8 ft.

#### Description of monument and accessories l'established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the True Corner Point, we set a 2"x30" Galvanized Iron Pipe, 28" in the ground on a steep NW slope, with brass cap attached,

From which we mark new BTs:

A 6" White Fir, scribed "T1N R38E S7 BT" on a double blaze bears N49½°E 53.1 ft.,

And a 6" Spruce, scribed "T1N R38E S18 BT" on a double blaze bears S19  $^{\rm D}$ E 25.7 ft.

Attached brass washer, marked "LS 1099" to lower blaze of new BTs. Placed steel fence post 5 ft. N of monument with sign 54-4 attached. Attached signs and painted BTs per Standard Specifications for Cadastral Survey, U.S.F.S. Region 6, October, 1979.
