
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At position as determined by survey, I set a 2½" x 30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 24 inches in the ground, from which;

NEW BEARING TREES:

A 13 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N 32° E, 10.07 feet marked C N BT A 15 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears S 40° E, 69.39 feet marked C X BT A 8 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears S 63° W, 36.95 feet marked C W BT A 11 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N 38° W, 24.60 feet marked C 1/4 S15 BT

Painted a 6" red band around all BTs and attached Bearing Tree signs.

Set a steel fence post approximately 5 feet North with a Land Survey Monument sign attached.
