
HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by Joseph G. Gray on a joint venture with O'Dell under GLO contract Number 120, dated May 27, 1867. Surveyor General record states:

I set a post at the 1/4 corner of sections 15 and 14 from which:

A larch 12 inches in diameter bears N 25° W, 55 lks.

A larch 11 inches in diameter bears S 40° E, 7 lks.



No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records. DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

None.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At proportionate position as determined by survey, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 22 inches in the ground, from which;


NEW BEARING TREES:

A 19 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N 30° E, 66.57 feet marked 1/4 S14 BT

A 26 inch diameter Douglas Fir bears S 21° E, 52.82 feet marked 1/4 S14 BT A 12 inch diameter Tamarack bears S 23° W, 58.58 feet marked 1/4 S15 BT A 20 inch diameter Blue Spruce bears N 54° W, 60.54 feet marked 1/4 S15 BT

Painted a 6" red band around all BTs and attached Bearing Tree signs.

Set a steel fence post approximately 5 feet North with a Land Survey Monument sign attached.
