
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by Joseph Gray and William Odell in GLO Contract No. 120, dated May 27, 1867. Surveyor General field notes state:

Set 1/4 Section cor. post in stone mound as per instructions.

In Survey Number 022-1997, Duane Griffith finds no remaining evidence of the corner.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the proportionate position, I set a 2 1/2" x 30" aluminum pipe, 25 inches in the ground, in a collar of stone 1 ft. diam., with a 2 ½" aluminum cap marked as shown below, from which:

- A 5/8" iron pin bears North $38^{\circ}08$ ' East, a distance of 17.46 feet, with a 1 ½" aluminum cap marked NERP.
- A 5/8" iron pin at the base of a railroad tie fence corner bears South 28°11' East, a distance of 15.03 feet, with a 1 ½" aluminum cap marked SERP.
- A 5/8" iron pin in an East/West running fenceline bears South 68°10' West, a distance of 27.01 feet, with a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap marked SWRP.
- A 5/8" iron pin bears North 62°20' West, a distance of 21.13 feet, with a 1 ½" aluminum cap marked NWRP.

Corner falls approximately 15 feet North of a fence corner. Fencelines run South and West.

I hereby certify that the corner was monumented on July 1, 2013.
