HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by Joseph G Gray and William H. Odell under joint GLO contracts no. 120, dated May 27, 1867. Surveyor General record states:

Set post corner for sections 4,5,8&9 from which:

A Pine 24 in dia bears S5°W, 43 lks

A Pine 24 in dia bears N75°W, 90 lks

A Pine 8 in dia bears N45°E, 125 lks

A Larch 24 in dia bears S60°E, 104 lks

Corner found by John W. Kimbrell under GLO contract number 579, dated June 22, 1891. Surveyor General record states:

Corner to Secs 4-5-8 and 9 which is a post from which a pine 24 ins dia brs S5°W 43 lks dist has been cut down. A Pine 24 ins dia brs N75°W 90 lks dist marked T1N R39E S5 BT. A Pine 8 ins dia brs N45°E 125 lks dist marked T1N R39E S4 BT. A Larch 24 ins dia brs S60°E 104 lks dist has been cut down. John P. Barnes House bears S30°W 235 lks dist.

County Survey Number 26-70 calls the section corner position at the intersection of Valley View County Road and the existing East-West fence line.

No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found no evidence of the GLO corner monument or accessories.

From the intersection of the centerline of Valley View County road and the existing East West fence line, searched at the position for the Barnes house. Found leveled out spot with old apple tree and well, no remains of the house visible.


DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the intersection of the centerline of Valley View County Road and the existing East-West fence lines, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 4 inches below the surface of the road, in a water valve box, from which;

From which:

A 5/8" x 30" iron pin (rebar) bears N24°E, 81.10 feet, with a 2" aluminum cap marked NE S4 RP
A 5/8" x 30" iron pin (rebar) bears S43°E, 37.74 feet, with a 2" aluminum cap marked SE S9 RP
A 5/8" x 30" iron pin (rebar) bears S43°W, 38.21 feet, with a 2" aluminum cap marked SW S8 RP
A 5/8" x 30" iron pin (rebar) bears N29°W, 39.82 feet, with a 2" aluminum cap marked NW S5 RP

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of new accessories. I used 20° East magnetic declination and the distances are to the center of the aluminum caps.
