History of original corner establishment:

Survey was performed by Timothy W. Davenport, Deputy Surveyor, under Contract No. 102 dated July 20, 1863. He set a wood post for the \$\frac{1}{4}\$ corn. common to Sections 13 & 18 T 1 N R 38 & 39 E.

The bearing trees were:

A pine 28" dia. bears N 68 E, 148 lks. dist. scribed \$\frac{1}{4}\$ BT.

A pine 8" dia. bears S 50 E, 183 lks. dist. scribed

Cap Stamped T 1 N R 38 E R 39 E 1/4 S 13 | S 18 1978 ORLS 645

Description of corner evidence found:

I found a pine alive and 39" dia. with a face exposed with $\frac{1}{4}S$ BT on the face. Also I found a pine stump approx. 16" dia. and evidence of it being the second bearing tree as it fit the GLO call distance and bearing.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

I set a stamped $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap on a 30" galv. iron pipe at the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner location by intersecting the GLO bearings & distances from the two found trees, I then placed a large mound of stone about the monument, it is located approx. N 45 E, 0.75 feet from a 14" pine. I then set new bearing trees as follows: A pine 11" dia. bears N 35 E, 38.0 feet and scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S S 18 BT. A pine 10" dia. bears N 36 W, 79.7 feet and scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S S 13 BT.
