

A Pine 12" in diameter bears N55°W; A Pine 12" in diameter bears S62°W, a distance of 40 links;

A Pine 12" in diameter bears N35°E, a distance of 20 links; A Pine 12" in diameter bears SE, a distance of 61 links;

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

After extensive searching for corner evidence no evidence was found for the original section corner monument. I established its position by proportionate measurement. I set a 2 ½" x 30" aluminum pipe with a 2 1/2" aluminum cap marked as shown below from which:

A 12" Ponderosa Pine bears N47°E, a distance of 21.05 feet, marked T1N R39E S19 BT.


A 23" Ponderosa Pine bears S10°E, a distance of 35.00 feet, marked T1N R39E S30 BT. A 22" Ponderosa Pine bears S13°W, a distance of 88.05 feet, marked T1N R38E S25 BT. A 40" Ponderosa Pine bears N27°W, a distance of 6.30 feet, marked X BT.



I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the accessories. Bearings are to a brass washer marked OPLS 83571 in the upper portion of the lower blaze. I use 16° East declination. The distance are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing trees.
