
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner was originaly set by William H. Odell and Joseph G. Gray under GLO joint contract number 120, dated May 27, 1867.

Surveyor General record states:

Set post for 1/4 corner to secs 11 & 14 in mound of stone.


At the proportionate position determined by survey, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 24 inches in the ground, from which;


NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 27 inch Ponderosa Pine bears N52°E, 95.36 feet marked 1/4 S 11 BT A 37 inch Ponderosa Pine bears S35°E, 150.40 feet marked 1/4 S 14 BT A 5/8 x 30 inch rebar with aluminum cap bears S46°W, 6.07 feet marked SW RP A 5/8 x 30 inch rebar with aluminum cap bears N41°W, 5.26 feet marked NW RP

Raised mound of stone, 3 foot base to top cap. Set a steel fence post approximately 5 feet East Attention sign attached.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of new accessories. I used 20° East magnetic declination and the distances are to a 50d spike driven in the right side of the root crown. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 644 to the BT blaze.
