Description of corner evidence found:

At assumed corner location I found a 19 x 7 x 6" basalt stone 10" above ground. No markings. Note: This stone apparently was set at some later date replacing the original wooden post. The stone was set in a mound of stone.

Found 16" pine stump with face charred bears N 70 .E, 58 lks.

Found badly burnt pine stump approx. 36" dia. which bears S 20 W, 53 lks.

Description of monument and accessories t established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

At corner location I set a 2" galv. iron pipe with brass cap approx. 18" above surface of rocky ground, in a mound of stone 3 ft. dia. and $l\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high. Cap stamped as shown above.

Bearing trees:

A 8" P. pine bears N 55 E, 45.75 ft. scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT.

A 9" P. pine bears N 03 W, 67.20 ft. scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT.
