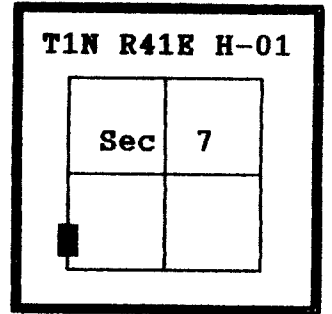


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

Survey 95-74 calls setting "IP" at corner point.

No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found 5/8" iron pin (rebar) as per survey 95-74.

See Union County survey 002-1994.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED  
TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

The true corner position bears N 85°E, 2.10 feet. An additional monument was not set.

The bearing trees are referenced to the found 5/8" iron pin.

A 15" Douglas Fir bears N18°E, 56.06 feet, marked "S 1/16 S7 BT".

A 9" Douglas Fir bears S23°W, 6.44 feet, marked "S 1/16 S12 BT".

Drove steel fence post 5' north of the 5/8" pin.
