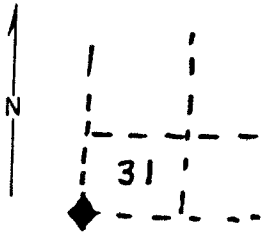

**History of original corner establishment:**

Corner originally established by Timothy W. Davenport under GLO Contract Number 102, dated July 20, 1863. Surveyor General record states: Set post for cor. to secs. 31 & 36 Township 1 North Ranges 40 & 41 East from which:

A Red Fir 24 inch in dia bears N25°W 37 lks dist

A Pine 20 inch in dia bears N20°E 9 lks dist

A Pine 20 inch in dia bears S65°W 72 lks dist

Corner remonumented by Wayne L. Rogers, under BLM Group No. 350, Survey dated May 8-10, 1973. His record states:

The cor of Tps 1 N, Rs 40 and 41 E, determined at record bearing and distance from the remains of the original bearing trees; A

Pine snag, size indeterminate, bears N20°E, 9 lks dist, with

fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze. A Pine snag, 24 ins diam, bears S65°W, 79

lks dist no marks visible on open burned blaze (Record 72 lks). A Fir root crown, bears

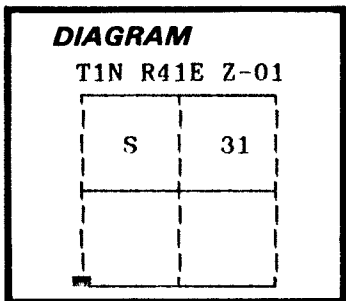
N25°W, 37 lks dist, no marks visible. At the corner point set an iron post 28 ins long 2½

ins diam 24 ins in the ground with brass cap marked (see markings below) from which new

bearing trees; A Fir, 10 ins diam bears N55°E, 55 lks dist mkd T1N R41E S31 BT. A Fir 14

ins diam bears N56°W, 126 lks dist mkd T1N R40E S36 BT.

No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records.



**Description of corner evidence found:**

Found 2½ inch diameter BLM brass cap marked as shown below.

**BLM Bearing Trees:**

Found a 12 inch diameter Douglas Fir N55°E, 55 lks live and vigorous with scribes visible.

Found a 16 inch diameter Douglas Fir N56°W, 126 lks live and vigorous with scribes visible.

Found the remains of the original GLO bearing trees as called in the BLM notes of Mr. Rogers.

## CHAINS

The following field notes describe the remonumentation of certain original corner points, township 1 south, range 41 east, of the Willamette meridian, Oregon, as provided for in the General Special Instructions, Group 350, Oregon, dated May 3, 1957, "Investigation of Collateral or Physical Evidence of Corner Positions and Accessories, Followed by Remonumentation of Corner Points with New Accessories when Needed."

The remonumentations of the original corner points was made at the request of the United States Forest Service, Wallowa-Whitman National Forest, in conjunction with their Land Line Location Program.

The mean magnetic declination is 20° E.
