The corner to Sections 2 and 3 from which:

A 24" Pine bears N 15° W 54 links,

A 24" Pine bears S 40° E 114 links,

A 20" Pine bears S 62° W 317 links.

Union County Survey No. 4 (McLain, 1953) shows a stone at the NE corner of Section 3, with an established fence line running South.

Union County Survey 25-71 indicates a "Corner Stone Found" at the "Correction Corner".



No evidence of the original corner was found.

At the corner of fences running South and East with a prominent cultivation line running West, we find an unmarked angular basalt stone, 14"x9"x5", lying on its side. This is the only stone visible in the immediate vicinity.

At the location of the found stone, we set a 2"x30" aluminum pipe 29" in the ground, with aluminum cap attached <u>marked</u>.




