At the intersection of the line between the section corners North and South, and the existing fence running East, I set a 5/8" x 30" iron pin with 2 1/2" aluminum cap marked as shown below, 4" below gravel road surface, from which:

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 5/8" x 30" Iron Pin with 1 ½" Aluminum cap bears N. 33°52'55" E., a distance of 23.67 feet, marked NE RP.

A railroad tie fence corner bears S. 88° E., a distance of 25.30 feet.

A 15" Ponderosa Pine bears S. 37° W., a distance of 53.00 feet, marked X BT.

A 12" Ponderosa Pine bears N. 82 ½° W., a distance of 50.48 feet, marked 1/4 S16 BT.

I hereby certify that the corner was monumented on February 29, 2008.





I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of new bearing trees. The magnetic declination used was 18° East. The distance to the bearing tree is to a 50d spike driven on the right side of the tree at the root crown. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 991 to the BT blaze. I used a Leica 500 series GPS RTK to establish the Iron Pin accessory. I used the same basis of bearing as that of Survey Number 004-2008.
