
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Survey was performed by David W. Thompson, Deputy Surveyor, ander Contract No. 103, dated Sept. 3, 1863. He states he marked a pine 10" dia. for \$\frac{1}{2}\$ sec. cor. mkd. \$\frac{1}{2}\$ S on N face Tron which:

A pine 2" dim. bears N 2 7, 17 lks. dist. mkd. 1 S BT. I \mathcal{A} in 12" dia. bears S 5 \mathcal{Z}_{\bullet} 86 lks. dist. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT.



Description of corner evidence found:

at the assumed corner location I found a pine 20" (10") dia. with ‡ 3 mkd. on the Tice. Free is alive and in good condition. Also I found both bearing trees dive and in good condition, however there is some descrepency in the CLO notes For the tree in section 36.
A pine 14" (3") dia. bears N 02 E, 11.22 (17 lks.) dist. (horiz. dist.) scribed

ping 19" (12") dia. bears S 15 E (S 5 E), 62.18' (94 lks.) rather than 86 lks.) Horiz. dist.).

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

lines the decorner is a pine tree alive and in good condition, I set a Witness Corner other the east-west line on a bearing of S 89 24 E, 5.0' from the center of the emisting tree. The witness corner being a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap on a 30" galv. iron pipe 6" above the ground surface, with a large mound of rocky soil around and covering the monument on a 25% side slope. I did not set new bearing trees; I only measured the bearings and distances to the existing bearing trees. From witness corner to existing learing trees:
