Found 39" pine in poor condition. The BT had a BLM tag on it, and was notched out so that scribing was exposed.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At record bearing and distance from the found BT I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown below, 23" in the ground, in a mound of stone 1' from base to top of cap from which:

A 21" Ponderosa Pine bears S75°E, a distance of 13.07 feet, marked T1S R40E S9 BT.

A 13" Ponderosa Pine bears S9°W, a distance of 46.25 feet, marked T1S R40E S8

An 18" Ponderosa Pine bears N70°W, a distance of 26.51 feet, marked T1S R40E S5 BT.
