Set a post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. square 24 ins. in ground for 1/4 sec. cor. 750 ft. below top of hill, marked 1/4 S on W. face, from which:

A fir 7 ins. in dia. bears N58°E, 11 lks. dist., marked 1/4 SBT. A fir, 6 ins. in dia. bears S22°W, 21 lks. dist. marked 1/4 SBT.

In Survey Number 38-80, James Hambleton finds no remaining evidence of the original GLO corner. Union County Monumentation record 154-80R states:






