

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by Henry Meldrum under GLO contract Number 450, dated December 1, Surveyor General record states:

T1S R40E J-09



Set post 4' by 4" ins sq. 24" in ground... from which:

A Pine 36" dia. bears N37°E, 152 lks.

A Pine 15" dia. bears N78°W, 42 lks.

A Pine 24" dia. bears S70°W, 49 lks.

A Pine 18" dia. bears S60°E, 53 lks.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At position determined by survey, I set a 21/2" x 30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown below, 24" in the ground from which:


A 13 inch Douglas Fir bears N32°E, a distance of 105.55 feet, marked T1S R40E S9 BT.


A 6 inch Ponderosa Pine bears S26°E, a distance of 46.33 feet, marked S16 T1S R40E BT.


A 16 inch Ponderosa Pine bears S46°W, a distance of 59.39 feet, marked S17 T1S R40E BT.

A 14 inch Douglas Fir bears N57°W, a distance of 86.89 feet, marked S8 T1S R40E BT.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 18° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the root crown of the bearing tree. A brass washer marked OPLS 2219 is attached to the BT blaze.
