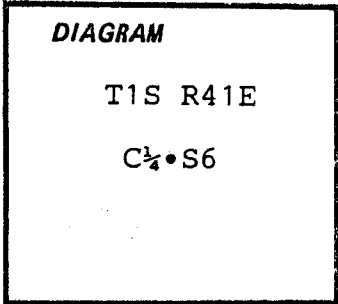

Set 2½" Brass cap in concrete 6" below the road surface. Two 60d spikes are imbedded in the concrete to provide iron for a magnetic locator. Set steel fence post 20 ft. east of corner on steep cutbank.

Painted blazes and attached signs as required in Specifications for Cadastral Surveys, USFS Region 6, March, 1982. A ¾" brass disk stamped "LS1848 nailed to lower end of blazes. To find corner take Rd. 6200600 1 mile South from 6200, corner is buried in the center of the road.

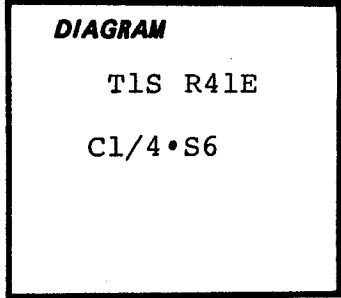

Note: This corner was previously established incorrectly in Survey of Record File No. 272-86R, recorded November 26, 1986. The monument described therein has been removed and placed as described below.



Description of corner evidence found:

From the corrected corner position,
Bearing trees found:

- 9.5" Douglas Fir bears S54 3/4°W, 48.5 ft., blazed & scribed: C1/4S6BT.
- 10" Douglas Fir bears S37 1/4°E, 150.3 ft., blazed & scribed: C1/4S6BT.

2 1/2" brass cap is set in concrete 6" below the road surface. Cap is stamped:

T1S R41E

RLS 1848
1986

Steel fencepost found 3.5 ft. west of corner.

Description of monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Cap is stamped: T1S R41E

Corner set by intersection. Set 2.5" brass cap in concrete 16" below surface on steep cut slope on east side of road. Imbedded a 3 1/2" ceramic magnet in concrete under the cap to provide magnetic attraction for metal detectors.

Used same BT's. Monument in center of road, set in error, was stamped and used as a reference monument. Cap is now marked:
