Corner perpetuated by W. Harris in 1978. Union County Monumentation Records state: Set a 2" x 30" iron pipe with brass cap marked as shown below. from which: A new bearing tree: An 8" fir N80°E 30.0' MKD. 1/4 S24 BT

Corner perpetuated by Kristian DeGroot in 1991. Union County Monumentation Records state: Found a 2 ½" iron pipe, projecting 10" above a 36" diameter stone mound, with brass cap marked as shown below. from which: An original bearing tree stump bears S67°W, 68.3 ft. with illegible scribe marks visible. A 10" fir bears N84°E 29.6 ft. with a healed blaze. A new bearing tree: A 16" fir bears S26°W 78.7 ft. scribed 1/4S23 BT.





I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 13° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
