A Pine 18 ins. diam bears N 8° W 25 lks dist A Fir 6 ins diam bears S 69° W 38 lks dist

Corner monumented by Wayne O. Harris in 1978. Union County Monumentation record 258-83R states:

Found Red painted mound of stones. 20" Pine NO8W 16.5' scribing visible.

Set 2"x30" iron pipe with brass cap marked as shown below

22" fir S08W 22.6' Mkd. 1/4 S5 BT

Fence running East/West through this corner.

Corner was found by Clayton Martin in Union County Survey # 045-1982. Record states: Found: A 2 ½" diam. brass cap set 18" above ground in a 2" diam. G.I. pipe in a rock mound and stamped per sketch. A 16" D.B.H. (22") Douglas Fir S 09° W 21.8' (22.8') scribed 1/4 S5 BT, Brass tag, A 16" D.B.H. Ponderosa Pine, N 08° W (16.5') 17.3', scribed 1/4 S BT (original) B.T. tags, Attention signs.

Found a 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " galvanized iron pipe, 18" above ground with  $\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap marked as shown, from which:

A 26" Douglas Fir bears South 9° West a dist. of 21.80 ft., alive and vigorous with healed blaze.

A 15" Ponderosa Pine bears North  $3^{\circ}$  West a dist. of 17.50 ft., alive and vigorous with Scribes Visible.

Steel fencepost bears East 5'





I used 13° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
