
# CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

#### HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

Corner originally established by Rufus Moore in GLO contract no. 382, dated March 23, 1881. Surveyor General field notes state:

Set post for 1/4 Sec. Cor, from which: A Fir, 8 in. diam. bears S37°W, 17 lks. dist. A Fir, 10 in. diam. bears N12°W, 24 lks. dist.



#### DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found remnants of an old rock jack. No discernable fence lines. Position of rock jack fits harmoniously with a proportionate position.

# DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED


# TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the position of the rock jack, I set a 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap, marked as shown below, 27 inches in the ground, from which:

#### NEW BEARING TREES:

A 10" Western Larch bears North 19° East, a distance of 14.80 feet, marked 1/4 S4 BT. An 8" Western Larch bears South 85° East, a distance of 9.70 feet, marked 1/4 S9 BT. A 14" Ponderosa Pine bears South 63° West, a distance of 22.00 feet, marked 1/4 S9 BT. A 6" Western Larch bears North 56° West, a distance of 20.15 feet, marked 1/4 S4 BT.

I set a steel fence post approximately 1 foot North of the corner monument. I hereby certify that the corner was perpetuated on October 26, 2015. Corner falls approximately 100 feet West of Darr Road.



I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 15° East declination. The distances are to a 60d spike driven into the left side of the root crown of the bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
