At the proportionate position, I set a 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe, with a 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap, marked as shown below, 30" in the ground with a collar of stone 1.5 feet diameter. From which:

#### NEW BEARING TREES:


A 4" Douglas Fir bears North, a distance of 21.25 feet, marked X BT.
A 14" Western Larch bears South 78° East, a distance of 11.90 feet, marked T2N R39E S10 BT.
A 5" Douglas Fir bears South 54° West, a distance of 31.20 feet, marked T2N R39E S9 BT.
An 11" Western Larch bears North 41° West, a distance of 47.70 feet, marked T2N R39E S4 BT.

I set a steel fencepost approximately 1 foot North of the corner monument.

I hereby certify that the corner was monumented on October 27, 2015.


