
History of original corner establishment:

Set a post.

16" Tamarack S71E 35 lks. 26" Tamarack S47W 151ks.



Description of corner evidence found: Red Painted Stone in Mound of Stones.

18" burned snag S47W 9.9" (Scribes visible)

Description of monument and accessories lestablished to perpetuate the original location of this corner: Set 2"x30" iron pipe with brass-cap marked: 1 S12 S7 1978 RLS 346

12" Fir N31W 7.1° Mkd. ‡S12 BT 10" Fir N62E 33.4° Mkd. ‡S7 BT

A 6° steel fence post is North of corner apx. 5°. All BT's have BT signs, red painted stripe, and brass washers marked RLS 346 nailed to lower face.

a red painted and blazed line runs North and South through this corner.

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

Corner originally established by Rufus S. Moore under GLO contract number 382 dated March 23, 1881. Surveyor General field notes state: Set post for 1/4 sec. cor. from which: A Tamarack 16 ins. diam bears S 71° E 35 lks dist A Tamarack 26 ins diam bears S 47° W 15 lks dist At top of hill bears NW & SE

Corner monumented by Wayne O. Harris in 1978. Union County Monumentation record 262-83R states:

Found Red painted stone in mound of stones. 18" Burned snag S47W 9.9' (scribes visible).

Set 2"x30" iron pipe with brass cap marked as shown below

12" fir N31W 7.1' Mkd. 1/4 S12 BT 10" fir N62E 33.4' Mkd. 1/4 S7 BT

Set steel fence post North or corner approx. 5'.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found a 2 ½" galvanized iron pipe, 10" above ground with 2½" brass cap marked as shown, with a 3' diam. collar of stone, from which:

An 18" Douglas Fir bears North 62° East a dist. of 33.4 ft., alive and vigorous with healed blaze An 18" White Fir bears North 31° West a dist. of 7.10 ft., alive and vigorous with healed blaze. An 18" x 10' uprooted and burned log bears South 10', lying alongside the road with scribes visible.

Steel fencepost bears North 5'


From the iron pipe monument:

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 7" White Fir bears South 19° East a dist. of 12.80 ft., marked 1/4 S7 BT. A 17" Douglas Fir bears South 68° West a dist. of 11.05 ft., marked 1/4 S12 BT.

Monument falls approx. 15 ft. North of Northwesterly bearing forest road.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 15° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.




