
- A 14" Western Larch bears North 80° East, a distance of 52.85 feet, marked 1/4 S11 BT.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 15° East declination. The distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
