
NEW BEARING TREES:

An 8" Douglas Fir bears South 78° West, a distance of 36.35 feet, marked T2N R39E S16 BT. A 6" Ponderosa Pine bears North 35° West, a distance of 37.85 feet, marked T2N R39E S9 BT.

I set a steel fencepost approximately 1 foot North of the corner monument.


