Description of corner evidence found:

Found charred stump of 40" pine and badly rotted uprooted pine approx. 36" dia. lying on the ground. By retracing the original line could verify these trees as being the original bearing trees, as they fit the GLO calls.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

Located the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner using the GLO calls and set a 5/8" x 30" iron pin with a cap stamped RLS 645 in a mound of stone. I then set two

new bearing trees as follows:

A douglas fir 7" dia. which bears S 62 W, 48.3 feet scribed \$\frac{1}{4}\$S S 22 BT.

A douglas fir 6" dia. which bears N 50E, 19.8 feet scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S S 23 BT.
