

Found a 5/8" iron pin 17" above ground in corner of steel "I" beam rock jack from which fences bear East, West, and North.

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 7" Ponderosa Pine bears North 17° East, a distance of 28.55 feet, marked 1/4S23 BT. A stone outcrop, the exposed face measuring 5' x 4' x 3' above ground bears South 65° East, a distance of 33.95 feet, marked X on top and BO on South West face. A 12" Douglas Fir bears South  $46^\circ$  West, a distance of 17.50 feet, marked 1/4S26 BT. A 6" Ponderosa Pine bears North 85° West, a distance of 20.85 feet, marked 1/4S23 BT.

Bearing is to a brass washer marked OPLS 83571 in the lower blaze of the trees and to the center of X for the outcrop.
