

# DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

## TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At position determined by survey, I set a 5/8" x 30" iron pin, 30 inches in the ground, with 2 ½" aluminum cap marked as shown below, from which:

A 14 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North 34 $^{\circ}$  East, a distance of 88.00 feet, marked CN 1/16 S34 BT.

A 7 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North 62° West, a distance of 105.75 feet, marked CN  $1/16~\mathrm{S34}$  BT.

Set a steel fencepost approximately 0.5 feet North of corner monument. Monument falls 22 feet South of an existing fence corner.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the accessories. I used 16° East declination. The distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the bearing trees.
