

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At position determined by survey, I set a 5/8" x 30" iron pin, 27 inches in the ground, with 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap marked as shown below, from which:

A 5/8" iron pin bears South a distance of 66.00 feet, with a yellow plastic cap marked BGB SURVEY MARKER.

A 15 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North 63° East, a distance of 35.45 feet, marked CW 1/16 S34 BT.

Set a steel fencepost approximately 1 feet North of the corner monument. Corner falls North approximately 42 feet and East 5 feet of a fence corner. I hereby certify that the corner was perpetuated on August 26, 2014.



I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the accessories. I used 16° East declination. The distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing tree. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the bearing tree.
