To restore corner for future use I set a 1" x 30" pipe w/cap stamped as per diagram in the center of the above said circle of stone, the place more stone to form a mound, from I set four new bearing trees, A Pine 580W, 15.3 14s. 6" dia. bears scribed TZN. R391 S 12 B.T. A Pine 8"dia. bears N36W SV.9 14 scribed TZN A39E S/ B.T. A Pine T'dio beors NSTE 76.8/ks. Scribed T2N R40E S6 BT. A Pine 5"dio. bears S38E, 87/ks. A Pine 7"dio Scribed TZN R40E

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Retracement of Range Line Fetween Sections 1 and 6

This is a retracement survey of the Range Line between sections 1 and 3, P 2 N, R 39 and 40 5, W., Union County Oregon as originally surveyed by Rufus S., oore, Feputy Surveyor under Contract No. 382, dated March 23, 1381.

After making an extensive search in the area of the 1/4 corner between sections 1 and 6, T 2 %, R 39 & 40 E, Wt, I found the 1/4 corner accessories as described in the original field notes, being a tamarack 24 ins. diameter which hears M 50 E, 16 1ks. distance, now being only a stump with PT sprited on the face.
A tamarack 40 %s. dia. which means N 45 W, 50 lks. dist, now being a body rotted stump that checks to the original notes.

To restore the 1/1 corner for future use, I set a 1" x 30" rite with car in a mound of stone, from the existing bearing trees, stamped:

T 2 N R 39 E 40 E S 1 S 6 1/4 1969

From which I set two new earing trees being:
A line 10" dia. which nears N 40 00 W, 10 lks. dist. scribed S 1 1/4 BT.
A Fir 11" dia. which bears N 36 30 E, 28 lks. dist. scribed S 1 1/4 BT.

Thence ty backsighting on the section corner common to sections 31, 36, 1, & 6 of Tele 2 N, R 39 & 40 E, Whof which was visible on the distant ridge top, I then plunged the line south on a bearing of S 00° 18' 12" W determined by a solar observation.

Set a temporary point opposite of a small circle of stones that looked very suspicious. I then made an extensive search of the area and found additional evidence of corner accessories as described in the original field notes, being two badly rotted stumps:

A pine stump about 22" dis. bears 5 42 E, 89 lks. from the circle of stone, with chirs of rotted wood showing evidence of scribing.

A Pine stump about 26" dia. bears 5 59 %, 28 lks. from the circle of stone being very badly rotted.

Thus accepting this evidence as the original corner and to restore the section corner for outure use, I set a 1" x 30" pine with cap in a mound of stone, from the existing bearing trees, stamped:



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With the true section corner established at a point being 15.4 lks. east of my temporary point; thence I made the necessary adjustment so that the true line between the section corner common to 1, 12 & 6, 7, T 2 N, R 39 & 40 E and the 1/4 corner common to sections 1 and 6, T 2 N, R 39 & 40 E, Whi, being N 00 04' 49" E a distance of 40.087 chains, thus completing this survey.

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HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

Corner originally established by Rufus Moore in GLO contract no. 382, dated March 23, 1881. Surveyor General field notes state:

Set post for cor. to secs.1, 12, 6 and 7, from which:

A pine 30 ins. diam. bears N37°E, 68 lks. dist. A pine 24 ins. diam. bears N64°W, 44 lks. dist.

A pine 26 ins. diam. bears S59°W, 28 lks. dist. A pine 22 ins. diam. bears S42°E, 89 lks. dist.

In Union County Survey Number 24-70, James Hambleton brings the monument to county standard from original GLO evidence. Survey states:

Found evidence of accessories as described in the original

field notes. Being badly rotted stumps and a circle of

small stones as if placed about the base of a post. One pine stump bears S42E, 89 lks. from the stones and there was evidence of scribing on portions of rotted wood. One pine stump bears S59W, 28 lks. from the stones, but was badly rotted. To restore the corner for future use, I set a 1" \times 30" pipe w/cap in the center of the above said circle of stone then place more stone to form a mound, from which I set four new bearing trees, A pine, 6" dia. bears S80W, 15.3 lks. scribed T2N R39E S12 BT.

A pine, 8" dia. bears N35W, 31.9 lks. scribed T2N R39E S1 BT. A pine, 7" dia. bears N59E, 76.8 lks. scribed T2N R40E S6 BT. A pine, 5" dia. bears S38E, 87 lks. scribed T2N R40E S7 BT.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

I find no remaining evidence of the monument set by Survey 24-70. A prominent railroad tie fence corner falls very close to the corner position, fences bears North/South and West, from which:

An 18" Ponderosa Pine bears North 50° East, a distance of 50.7 feet, alive and vigorous with a healed blaze.

A 12" Ponderosa Pine bears South 38° East, a distance of 57.4 feet, alive and vigorous with a healed blaze.

A Pine stump, bears South 87° West, a distance of 10.3 feet, with healed blaze.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED


TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the intersection of the distances from the three remaining bearing trees, I set a 5/8" x 30" iron pin, with 2 ½" aluminum cap, marked as shown below, 20 inches in the ground, alongside the Northwest side of the aforementioned railroad tie fence corner, from which:

NEW BEARING TREES:


Douglas Fir bears South 72° West, a distance of 16.25 feet, marked T2N R39E S12 BT. A 15" A 13" Ponderosa Pine bears North 43° West, a distance of 27.90 feet, marked T2N R39E S1 BT.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 15° East declination. The distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
