#### DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found Northeast bearing tree, blazes evident, did not open for scribes. Tree is now a 25" diameter Ponderosa Pine, with double blaze. Found numerous stones of called size in rock jack, but without marks.

#### DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

#### TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At record bearing and distance from found bearing tree, I set a 2½" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 23" in the ground and raised a mound of stone with a 2ft base to top of cap. From which:

#### NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

An 8"x8" railroad tie fence corner bears N 30° E, a distance of 3.35 feet.

A 25" diameter Ponderosa Pine ( original tree ) bears N 8° W, a distance of 70.00 feet, blazes evident.

A 28" diameter Ponderosa Pine bears S 81° W, a distance of 83.62 feet, marked X BT.

A 20" diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N 21° W, a distance of 51.76 feet, marked  $\stackrel{1}{4}$  S 18 BT.



I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 17° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the new bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 991 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
