A root hole, bears N. 73½° W., 38 lks. dist., with a lodgepole pine, 11 ins. diam., lying alongside, with scribe marks T2S R34E CC S35 UIR BT on partially healed blaze. (Record, N. 15° E., 39 lks.)

A root hole, bears N. 44° W., 33 lks. dist., with a pine, 14 ins. diam., lying alongside, with illegible scribe marks on partially healed blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Barbour

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 27° E., 15 lks. dist., with scribe marks T2S R34E S35 BT on partially healed blaze.

A larch, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 64° W., 130 lks. dist., with scribe marks T2S R34E S34 BT on partially healed blaze.

Mark the brass cap AM and bury the iron post in place.

N. 0° 05' 00" W., bet. secs. 34 and 35.

Ascend broken SE. slope, through timber and light undergrowth.

5.50 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 80° E. and S. 80° W.

12.60 Top of ascent; thence over level ground.

20.095 Point for the N 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 34 and 35.

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 8 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, supported in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

steel fence post alongside the stainless steel post.
