CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner was originally established by Currin and Noland under GLO contract during July, 1887. Their position was a 8" tamarac. The corner was recovered by L. Wilkes, survey group No. 38, in October, 1917. By his survey the corner was moved 9 lks. north to the boundary. At this time it became the closing corner from the north. Later it also became the closing corner from the south as well. The

final stamped pipe is shown below. Surveyor General's notes state: "Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 32 and 33, with brass cap marked: From which: A tamarack, 15 ins. diam., bears N48°30'E, 43 lks. dist., marked CC T2S R34E S33 BT. A tamarack, 16 ins. diam., bears N20°30'W, 97 lks. dist., marked CC T2S R34E S32 BT. I obliterate marks on old closing cor. and bearing trees. Intersect the S. bdy. of the original Umatilla Indian Reservation at the new closing cor. of that portion of secs. 32 and 33 within the original reservation, which is a 2 in.

iron post, firmly set in the ground, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. I change the marking on the brass cap to read:"

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found no trace of 1917 brass cap. Found 12" dead tamarac with partially opened blaze and partially visible C. Measured North, 5.9 ft., from which: A 16" dead tamarac bears N48°E, 28.4 ft. with full scribe. A 26" tamarac bears N22°W, 65.5 ft. with grown over blazes. A dead 10" lodgepole pine, bears S34°E, 11.0 ft. with visible BT.

The corner postions is north of an east-west fence, in a track road.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the above point, set 2 1/2" X 30" galvanized pipe and brass cap marked: Set pipe 25" in the ground. No rock in the area. From which by magnetic declination of N20°E: A 9" fir bears N73°E, 40.6 ft., scribed T2S R34E S33 CC BT. A 9" fir bears S63°E, 45.6 ft., scribed T2S R34E S33 CC BT. A 14" tamarac bears S62°W, 50.0 ft. scribed T2S R34E S32 CC BT. Painted blazes red and 6" red band around. Placed $54\text{-}3\text{s},\ 54\text{-}4\text{s},\ \text{and}$ brass washers stamped PLS 1051 on the BTs. Placed 54-4 on a steel fence post 5' east of the corner.
