
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

Index File No. X-21

History of original corner establishment:

Corner was originally established by Currin & Noland under GLO contract, on July 16, 1887. Surveyors General's notes state: Set a post 3 ft. long 3 ins. square 24 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor. marked 1/4S on W face, from which: A fir 16 ins. diam. bears S 70°E 25 lks. dist. marked 1/4S BT. A fir 18 ins. dia. bears N25°W, 40 lks. dist. marked 1/4S BT."



Description of corner evidence found:

Found 3" x 24" scribed wood post from which: A 20% fir snag bears N67°E, 2.0 ft. A 24% green fir bears S36°W, 23.0 ft. with grown over blazes and bark scribed 1/4. Post was set in mound of stone.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At center of post set 2 1/2" X 30" galvanized pipe and brass cap marked; Set pipe 24" in the ground and mound of stone around to cap.

From which by magnetic declination of N20°E:

A 24" tamarac bears S82°E, 36.4 ft. scribed 1/4S36 BT.

Placed 54-3s and 54-4s on old BTs. Painted blazes red and 6" red band around.

Placed 54-3, 54-4 and brass washers stamped PLS 1051 on BTs. Placed 54-4 on steel fence post 5" south of the corner.

CHAINS

(Restoring the survey by James P. Currin and James E. Noland, in 1887, and the resurvey by Lincoln L. Wilkes, in 1917)

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, perpetuated and recorded by Barry B. Barbour, Registered Land Surveyor No. 1051, in 1980, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 6 ins. above ground, in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.

from which an original bearing tree

A larch, 17 ins. diam., bears S. $79\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E., 55 lks. dist., with scribe marks /4 S36 BT on chopped open blaze. (Record, fir, S. 70° E., 25 lks.)

and a bearing tree mkd. by Wilkes

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 80° E., 2 lks. dist., no marks visible on partially healed, rotted blaze.

and the remains of a bearing tree of no known record

A fir snag, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 38° W., 35 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks on bark.

S. 2° 27' 00" W., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over level ground, through timber and light undergrowth.

Intersect the E. bdy. of the Umatilla Indian Reservation at the original closing cor. of secs. 35 and 36, designated as the closing cor. for both sides of the Reservation boundary by Wilkes in 1917, perpetuated and recorded by Barry B. Barbour, Registered Land Surveyor No. 1051, in 1980, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 8 ins. above ground, with
