

CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment: Corner originally established by Jacob C. Cooper under contract #397 dated July 1, 1881. Corner perpetuated by Lincoln E. Wilks under special instructions dated April 18, 1917. Group 38.

Mr. Wilks' notes, in the Umatilla County record, states that he perpetuated this corner as follows: Set iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in ground, for cor. of Secs. 25, 30, 31, 36, with brass cap marked

from which a fir, 24 ins. diam., brs. N.39°E. 45 lKs. dist., marked T.2S., R.35E., S.30 B.T. (old B.T.)

A fir, 20 ins. diam., brs. S.65°E., 16 lKs dist. marked T.2S., R.35E., S. 31, B.T. (old B.T.).

A fir, 10 ins. diam., brs. S.18°30'W., 69 lKs. dist. marked T.2S., R.34E., S. 36, B.T. (New B.T.)

A fir, 30 ins. diam. brs. N.58°30'W., 40 lKs dist. Marked T.2S., R.34E., S.25, B.T. (old B.T.). The true course and distance of this line from the 1/4 sec. cor. is S., 40.25 chs.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found 1917 GLO brass cap on iron pipe lying along fence line.

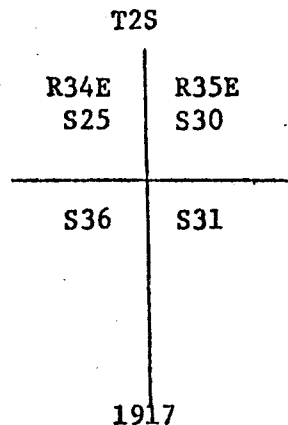
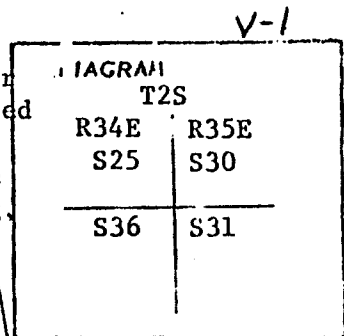
Found 4 B.T.s as listed below:

In S30, found broken snag with clear scribing.

In S31, found dead but standing Doug. fir. Did not open scar.

In S36, fir snag with visible scribing.

In S25, dead and down Doug. fir with visible scribing.



Description of monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

Using B.T. bearings and distances I reset the 1917 iron pipe with brass cap and raised stone mound around it. I stamped "Reset 1978" below the original stamping. I established 4 new B.T.s as follows:

An 11" white fir bears N37°E, 48.5 feet dis. markes T2S, R35E, S30, B.T.

A 12" western larch bears S40°45'E, 35 feet dist. marked T2S, R35E, S31, B.T.

A 14" white fir bears S64°W, 24.6 feet dist. marked T2S, R34E, S36, B.T.

A 9" white fir bears N63°30'W, 22 feet dist. marked T2S, R34E, S25, B.T.

All distances are horizontal to tree center.

All B.T.s have B.T. tags and signs warning against destruction.

Scribed areas on all B.T.s painted red.

I set an iron post beside brass cap with sign warning against destruction and a property boundary sign.

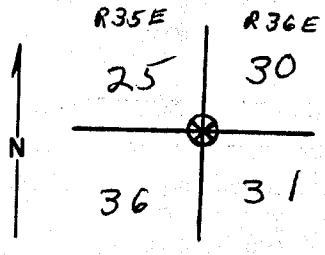
