
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by John A. Hurlburt under GLO contract number 201, dated August 5, 1873. Surveyor General record states:

Set basalt stone 24x10x8 10 in. in ground and built stone mound 2 ft. high for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.




No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found stone 22x10x8 inches marked $\frac{1}{4}$. Stone found in rockjack with fences running North and South.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner: At the Northwest corner of the rockjack, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 26 inches in the ground, from which:

New Bearing Trees: A 19 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears S46°W, 175.41 feet marked ½ S35 BT A 15 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N75°W, 144.75 feet marked ½ S26 BT


Painted a 6 inch red band around all BTs and attached bearing tree and land survey monument signs.


Set a steel fencepost approximately 5 feet East with land survey monument and property boundary signs attached.

Buried the original corner stone North and alongside of monument. Raised mound of stone around monument, 2 ft. base to top of cap.

I hereby certify that the above corner point wa perpetuated as hereon described on May 5, 1989.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of new accessories. I used 17° East magnetic declination and the distances are to a 50d spike driven in the right side of the root crown. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 644 to the BT blaze.

History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by John A. Hurlburt under GLO contract number 201, dated August 5, 1873. Surveyor General records state: Set a basalt stone 24"X10"X8", 10" in ground and built stone mound 2' high for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor.

In June of 1989 Duane Griffith, OPLS 644, found a stone 22"X10"X8" marked $\frac{1}{4}$ in a rock jack with fence running North and South. He set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ "X30" aluminum pipe with

aluminum cap, 26" in the ground. From which:

A 19" ponderosa pine bears S 46° W 175.41 feet, marked \$\frac{1}{4}\$S35BT.

A 15" ponderosa pine bears N 75° W 144.75 feet, marked \$\frac{1}{4}\$S26BT.

Set a steel fencepost approximately 5 feet East with land survey monument and property boundary signs attached.

Description of corner evidence found:

A $2\frac{1}{2}$ " X 30" aluminum pipe with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap surrounded with a mound of earth and stone from which:

A 19" ponderosa pine bears S $46\frac{1}{2}$ ° W - 175.4 feet. A 15" ponderosa pine bears N $75\frac{1}{4}$ ° W - 144.7 feet.

Corner is 1.5 feet East of a N-S fence and 3.0 feet North of a rock jack with a Forest Service location poster.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

New bearing trees established:

A 20" ponderosa pine bears N $46\frac{1}{2}$ ° E - 369.8' scribed " $\frac{1}{4}$ S26BT". A 20" ponderosa pine bears S 13° E - 143.5' scribed " $\frac{1}{4}$ S35BT". New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped "PLS 1106" nailed to face of blaze. Attached sign 54-3 & 54-9, painted face of blaze & a red 6" band around each tree.

Repainted blaze and 6" red band on old bearing trees.

A Warren Knight staff compass and steel tape was used to tie bearing trees.

I hereby certify that the above corner monument was properly maintained to U.S.F.S standards by me on November 11, 1994.

Compass declination 18° East.
