DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the position of the 1/16 corner established by Survey Number 030-2002, I set a $5/8" \times 30"$ iron pin with a 2 ½" aluminum cap marked as shown below, 25" in the ground with a mound of stone 1 ft. from base to top of cap, from which;

NEW BEARING TREES:

A 9" diameter Ponderosa Pine bears North 7 $^{\circ}$ West, a distance of 72.70 feet marked X BT.

A 16" diameter Ponderosa Pine bears South 68° West, a distance of 45.70 feet, marked S1/16 S14 BT.

I set a steel fence post 1 ft. North of the monument. An existing fence cornering East, North, and West is 7.7 ft. South and 4.1 ft. East of the monument.




