
NEW BEARING TREES:

A 14" diameter Ponderosa Pine bears South 34° East, a distance of 95.39 feet marked W1/16 S24 BT.


A 15" diameter Larch bears North 61° West, a distance of 20.43 feet, marked W1/16 S13 BT.

I set a steel fence post 1 ft. North of the monument. There is an existing blaze line to the monument.

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I used a Leica TCA-1100 and prism in the establishment of the new accessories. The basis of bearings is the same as that shown on Survey No. 030-2002, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing tree. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 991 to the BT blaze.
