

The original bearing tree bears S 30° W, 58 1ks (38.3 ft) marked ...4 S.. on partially healed and burned blaze.

Attached a sign 54-3 below a 6 inch band of red paint and a sign 54-4 on opposite side of tree from BT blaze to each of the existing bearing trees.
