





Survey number 4-81 done by me in December of 1980 and January of 1981 reestablished this corner by double proportion. I set a 2121 x 3011 iron pipe with brass cap marked as shown below from which:

A 12 inch diameter tamarack bears N57°E, 46.4 feet marked T3N R39E S2 BT A 12 inch diameter red fir bears \$38°E, 53.8 feet marked T3N R39E \$11 BT A 10 inch diameter tamarack bears \$79°W, 15.0 feet marked T3N R39E \$10 BT A 14 inch diameter tamarack bears N12°W, 11.6 feet marked T3N R39E \$3 BT

An error was found concerning the position of this corner. Upon review of my field notes, I find an error in the field during the placing of the brass cap itself. The information provided on survey number 4-81 is correct, but the brass cap was not set in the true double proportionate position. I therefore remove the brass cap from the erroneous position and place it at the true double proportionate position. The bearing trees remain in the same quadrants, and they still face the corner with the exception of the Northwest tree. I did not rescribe any of the BTs, so as not to risk damage to the tree. I placed new bearing tree tags on the existing bearing trees with the true information on them. The true bearings and distances are as shown below.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

From the true double proportionate position:

A 12 inch diameter tamarack bears $N58^{\circ}E$, 32.5 feet marked T3N R39E S2 BT A 12 inch diameter red fir bears $S24^{\circ}E$, 54.4 feet marked T3N R39E S11 BT A 10 inch diameter tamarack bears $S68^{\circ}W$, 28.5 feet marked T3N R39E S10 BT A 14 inch diameter tamarac k bears $N76^{\circ}W$, 15.0 feet marked T3N R39E S3 BT

Set steel fence post approximately 5 feet South with 54-4 sign

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of these accessories. I used 17 East magnetic declination and the distances to the bearing trees are to the center of the tree. I placed a brass washer marked OPLS 644 by the BT blaze of the bearing trees.
