History of original corner establishment:

Survey was performed by Rufus Moore, Deputy Surveyor, under contract No. 437, dated June 3, 1882. He set a fir post for the ½ corner common to Sections 32 and 33 T 3 N R 39 E WM. The bearing trees were:
A fir 10" dia. bears N 82 E, 54 lks. dist. scribed ½ S BT.
A fir 12" dia. bears West, 50 lks. dist. scribed ½ S BT.

## Description of corner evidence found:

Form

Found a white fir, now 28" dia. and alive in Section 33; the face being chopped out to expose the scribing  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. Found a stump hole fitting the bearing and distance in Section 32; no other evidence available.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

I set a stamped  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap on a 30" galv. iron pipe at the  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner location, by using the GLO call bearing and distance from the live bearing tree. I then placed a mound of stone around the monument. I then set new bearing trees as follows: A larch 10" dia. bears N 52 E, 58.0 feet (slope distance) and scribed  $\frac{1}{4}$  S S 33 BT. A white fir 11" dia. bears N 67 W, 40.0 feet (slope distance) and scribed  $\frac{1}{4}$  S S 32 BT.
