# CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Survey was performed by Herman D. Cradon, Deputy Surveyor under contract No. 517 dated Sept. 30, 1884. He set a post 3½ feet long 3" sq. for the 2 corner. The bearing trees were:

A tamarack 12" dia. bears N  $2^{1}+$  E, 32 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S BT.

A tamarack 15" dia. bears S 25 E, 14 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S BT.

# Description of corner evidence found:

I found a tall tamarack stump in section 8 with the scribing  $\frac{1}{4}$  S BT. I also found a stump hole in the position of the bearing tree in section  $\tilde{\sigma}$ .

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

I then restored the  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner to its original position by using the GLO call bearing and distance from the bearing tree in section 8. I set a stamped  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap on a 30" galv. iron pipe at the location of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner. I set two new bearing trees as follows:

A red fir 8" dia. which bears N 25 W, 9.0 feet and scribed  $\frac{1}{4}$  S S 5 BT.

A larch 14" dia. which bears S 49 E, 17.1 feet and scribed 1 S S 8 BT.

### HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Originally set by the subdivision of Township 3 North, Range 40 East by Herman Gradon in Contract Number 517, dated September 30, 1884. Surveyor General record states:

Set a post, 3 1/2 ft. long, 3 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground for cor 1/4 Sec Cor, marked 1/4 S on N. face, from which:

A tamarack 12 ins. in diam bears N24°E, 32 lks. dist., marked 1/4 S BT.

A tamarack 15 ins. in diam. bears S25°E, 14 lks. dist. marked 1/4 S BT.

Corner found by James Hambleton in 1977. Union County Surveyor monumentation record 190-83R states: Found a tall tamarack stump in section 8 with scribing  $1/4\ \mathrm{S}$ BT. I also found a stump hole in the position of the bearing tree in section 5. I then restored the 1/4 corner to its original position by using the GLO call bearing and distance from the bearing tree in section 8. I set a stamped 2 ½" brass cap on a 30" galv. iron pipe at the location of the 1/4 corner. I set two new bearing trees as follows:
A red fir 8" dia. which bears N 25 W, 9.0 feet and scribed 1/4 S S 5 BT.
A larch 14" dia. which bears S 49 E, 17.1 feet and scribed 1/4 S S 8 BT.

### DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found a 2 ½" iron pipe with a 2 ½" brass cap, marked as shown below, 3 inches above ground, from which:

A 14 inch standing dead Tamarack bears South 55° East, a distance of 17.1 feet, with scribe marked "1/4 S S 8 BT" visible on an open blaze. A 14 inch Douglas Fir bears North 15° West, a distance of 9.0 feet, alive and vigorous with

healed blaze.

#### DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

#### NEW BEARING TREES:

A 12 inch White Fir bears North 45° East, a distance of 9.25 feet, marked 1/4 S5 BT. An 11 inch White Fir bears South 9° East, a distance of 22.70 feet, marked 1/4 S8 BT. A 9 inch Ponderosa Pine bears South 44° West, a distance of 38.35 feet, marked 1/4 S8 BT.

Corner falls approximately 50 feet North of an old logging road.

A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
