Set pipe 22" in the ground and mound of stone around to cap. Placed marked stone at base of pipe.


Corner originally established by Herman D. Gradon under GLO contract number 517 dated September 30, 1884. Surveyor General field notes state: Set basalt stone 18x15x9, 12 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. Cor. marked 1/4 on W. face, from which:

A Tamarack 12 ins. in diam. bears N 75° E 24 lks. dist.

marked 1/4 S.B.T.

A Pine 12 ins. in diam. bears S 41° W 16 lks. dist. marked 1/4 S.B.T.

In 1979 Barry Barbour found the original stone. Union County Monumentation Record 200-83R states: Found 15x10x9 inch stone, firmly set in small mound of stone dimly marked 1/4 on West face. A dead 18" tamarac bears N71°E, 16.0 ft. with grown over blazes. At center of above described rock set 2 1/2" x 30" galvanized pipe with brass cap marked: Set pipe 22" in the ground and mound of stone around to cap. Placed marked stone at base of pipe. From which: A 14" fir bears N48°E, 82.0 ft., scribed 1/4 S10 BT. A 13" fir bears S47°W, 70.8 ft., scribed 1/4 S9 BT. Placed steel fence post 5' North of corner.

Found a 2 1/2" iron pipe, 8" above ground and in a 2' diam. collar of stone, with 2 1/2" brass cap marked as shown below, from which:

An 18" Western Larch bears North 75° East, a dist. of 16.00 ft., dead and down with scribes visible on opened blaze. An 18" White Fir bears South 47° West, a dist. of 70.80 ft., alive and vigorous with healed

blaze. (slated to be logged) No sign of Northeast bearing tree.

Fence post bears approx. 5' North


