From which: A 20" white fir stump bears N41°E, 13.8 ft. A 22" t stump bears S88°E, 25.3 ft. A 24" white fir bears N62°W, 7.7 ft. No trace of SW BT. A 22" tamarac

Magnetic variation used: N20°E.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the center of the above described stone set 2 1/2" by 30" galvanized pipe with brass cap marked: T3NR40E S8 | S9 Set pipe 22" in the ground and mound of stone around S17 | S16 OR PLS 1051 to cap. Placed marked stone at base of pipe. From which: A 14" white fir bears N59°E, 27.8 ft., scribed T3NR40E S9 BT. A 12" white fir bears S82°E, 21.9 ft., scribed T3NR40E S16 BT. A 14" white fir bears S32°W, 21.4 ft., scribed T3NR40E S17 BT. Placed 54-3 on old and new BTs. Placed brass washer stamped PLS 1051 on foot blaze of new BTs. Painted blazes red and 6" red band around.



A the center of the above described stone set 2 ½" by 30" galvanized pipe with brass cap marked as shown below: Set pipe 22" in the ground and mound of stone around to top of cap. Placed marked stone at base of pipe. From which: A 14" white fir bears S82°E, 27.8 ft., scribed T3NR40E S9 BT. A 12" white fir bears S82°E, 21.9 ft., scribed T3NR40E S16 BT. A 14" white fir bears S32°W, 21.4 ft., scribed T3NR40E S17 BT.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " iron pipe with a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap, marked as shown below, 6 inches above ground, from which:

A 23" white fir bears North 61° East, a distance of 27.8 feet, alive and vigorous with healed blaze.

A fir stump bears South 86° East, a distance of 21.9 feet.

A 19" white fir bears South 30° West, a distance of 21.4 feet, alive and vigorous with scribe marks visible on a partially healed blaze.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

NEW BEARING TREES:

A 10 inch Ponderosa Pine bears South 21° East, a distance of 44.0 feet, marked T3N R40E S16 RT.

A 4 inch Douglas Fir bears North 13° West, a distance of 3.50 feet, marked X BT.

Corner falls approx. 30 feet South of a logging road, 100 feet West of Forest Road No. 6231 and 30 feet North of a creek.


