
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

Corner originally established by Herman Gradon under GLO contract number 517 dated Sept. 30th, 1884. Surveyor General field notes state:

Set a basalt stone 15 x 10 x 8, from which: A Pine 24 in. diam. bears S81°W 6 lks. dist. marked 1/4 SBT. A Pine 24 in. diam. bears S84°E 19 lks. dist. marked 1/4 SBT.

Corner found and tied to by railroad right of way survey dated June 30, 1916.



DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

None found. Area has been logged extensively with evidence of wildfires in the area.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO MONUMENT THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At surveyed position I set a 5/8" x 30" iron pin, drilled 28" in the ground, with 2 1/2" aluminum cap marked as shown below and in a 2' diam. collar of stone, From which:

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 5/8" x 30" iron pin bears North a dist. of 76.90 ft., with 1 ½" aluminum cap marked N RP. (pin falls on South edge of East/West bearing forest road and is marked with a 6 ft. fence post.) An 18" Ponderosa Pine bears South 86° East a dist. of 61.95 ft., marked 1/4 S21 BT. A 12" Ponderosa Pine bears South 50° West a dist. of 27.15 ft., marked 1/4 S20 BT. A 20" Ponderosa Pine bears North 79° West a dist. of 23.70 ft., marked 1/4 S20 BT.

Set steel fence post bears North approx. 1'

I hereby certify that the corner was monumented on October 15, 2020.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 14° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
