
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

In 1882, under GLO Contract No. 451, Rufus S. Moore set a stone 12x10x8, from which an 8"Pine bears N8°W, 69 lks. and a 12" Fir bears S8°E, 62 lks.



Description of corner evidence found:

Found BLM 3 1/4" brass cap on 2 1/2" iron pipe rising 22" in mound, stamped:

T3S R33 1/2E 1/4 S27 S26

Bearing Trees Found:

A 13.5" D. Fir bears 57 1/2°E, 41.1 ft., scribing visible "1/4 S"

scribing visible "1/4 S"
A 21.5" P. Pine bears N 1 1/2°W, 45.5 ft., scribing visible "1/4 S27 BT"

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

New BT:

A 9.0" W. Larch bears S10 1/2°E, 69.2 ft., scribed 1/4 S26 BT.

Painted blazes and attached signs as per <u>Standard Specifications</u> for <u>Cadastral Surveys</u>, USFS Region 6, March, 1982.

Compass Declination: 19 1/2°E

Witness: D. Scott

From 2115-135, take 2115-136 northerly and westerly .7 mi. Logging road goes northeasterly. Follow it 300 ft. Corner is about 150 ft. north on the edge of a bluff.

Remonumentation of Certain Original Corner Points, T. 3 S., R. 33½ E., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

CHAINS

A juniper, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 69° E., 142 lks. dist., with scribe marks T3S R33½E S35 BT visible on partially healed blaze. (Record, S. 70° E., 144 lks.)

- A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 22° W., 30 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.
- A pine, 22 ins. diam., bears N. 42 W., 47 lks. dist., with scribe marks T3S R33½E S27 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

from which a new bearing tree

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 57° E., 14½ lks. dist., mkd. T3S R33½ E S26 BT.

Deposit corner stone alongside iron post.

The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 26 and 27, determined at record bearing and distance from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 8° E., 62 lks. dist., with scribe marks / 4 S visible on partially healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 4 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, in a mound of stone, 5 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

A pine, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 2½° W., 69 lks. dist., mkd. ½ S27 BT.

The or. of secs. 22, 23, 26, and 27, determined at record distance from the remains of the original searing trees:

- A pine, 10 ins. diem., bears S. 36° E., 16 lks. dist., with scribe mark S visible on partially healed blaze.
- A fir, 12 ins. diam., hears S. 31%° W., 27 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, S. 30° W.)
