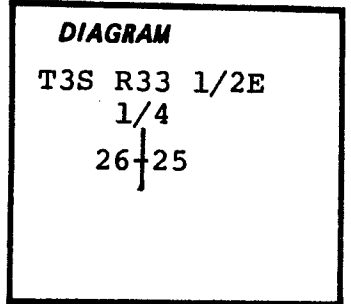


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

Index File No. T-21

History of original corner establishment:

In 1882, under GLO Contract 451, Rufus S. Moore set a stone 12x8x6, from which a 10" Tamarack bears N70°W, 8 lks. and a 6" Fir bears East, 3 lks.



Description of corner evidence found:

Found BLM 3 1/4" brass cap on 2 1/2" iron pipe rising 8", stamped:

Bearing trees found:

- A 10" W. Larch bears N70°W, 8 lks. to root hole, dead and down.
- A 15" D. Fir bears N23°W, 2.8 ft., scribing visible "1/4 S26 BT".
- A 13 1/2" W. Larch bears N83 1/2°E, 32.7 ft., scribing visible "1/4 S25 BT".
- A 12" Fir, dead & down, broken off stump, with healed blaze.

Description of monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Painted blazes and attached signs as per Standard Specifications for Cadastral Surveys, USFS Region 6, March 1982. Set metal fence post 4 ft. north of corner.

From 2115, follow 2115-108 southwesterly 1.5 mi. to the summit. On the right you will find a tree marked with a yellow tag. Corner is 120 ft. east.

CHAINS

The cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13, and 18, determined at record bearing and distance from the remains of the original bearing trees:

A root hole, bears N. 35° E., 26 lks. dist., with a down and decayed western larch alongside, 12 ins. diam., with scribe marks BT visible on decayed blaze.

A decayed western larch snag, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 42° E., 16 lks. dist., with scribe marks S R34E S18 visible on decayed blaze.

A pine snag, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 19° W., 42 lks. dist., with scribe marks T3S R33 1/2 E S12 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 55 1/2° W., 35 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. T3S R33 1/2 E S13 BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 15 1/4° W., 18 lks. dist., mkd. T3S R33 1/2 E S12 BT.

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 26, monumented with a basalt stone, 12 x 8 x 6 ins., loosely set 2 ins. in the ground, no marks visible, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A fir snag, 12 ins. diam., bears East, 3 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A western larch snag, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 70° W., 8 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S visible on open blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A western larch, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 80 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E.,
50 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S25 BT.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 25° W., 4 lks.
dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S26 BT.

Deposit corner stone alongside iron post.

The cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25, and 26, monumented with a
basalt stone, 18 x 18 x 12 ins., firmly set 6 ins. in
the ground, no marks visible, from which the remains of
the original bearing trees:

A fir snag, 28 ins. diam., bears S. 88° E., 181
lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on
partially healed blaze.

A root hole, bears N. 55° W., 40 lks. dist., with
a down and decayed pine alongside, 36 ins. diam.,
with scribe marks T3S R33 $\frac{1}{2}$ E S23 BT visible on
decayed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears S. 66° W., 47 lks.
dist., mkd. T3S R33 $\frac{1}{2}$ E S26 BT.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 41 lks.
dist., mkd. T3S R33 $\frac{1}{2}$ E S23 BT.

Deposit corner stone alongside iron post.

The cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34, and 35, monumented with a
basalt stone, 18 x 12 x 8 ins. (record, 20 x 13 x 10 ins.)
firmly set 10 ins. in the ground, no marks visible, from
which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A sawed pine stump, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 82° E.,
27 lks. dist., no marks visible.
